RESOLUTION 19

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Parker, Florida, herein called the "Applicant", after thorough consideration of the problem and available data, has hereby determined that the project described below is in the best interests of the Parker Police Department and the general public: "A CONTINUATION OF THE IMPLEMENTATION OF THE REGION I UNIFORM LAW ENFORCEMENT COMMUNICATION SYSTEM", to-wit: Providing radio communication equipment for the Parker Police Department, and

WHEREAS, under the terms of Public Law 90-351, the United States of America has authorized the Law Enforcement Assistance Administration, through the Florida Governor's Council on Criminal Justice, to make Federal Grants to assist local governments in the improvement of criminal justice; and

WHEREAS, the applicant has examined and duly considered the act of applying for and accepting a grant award under the provisions of the Omnibus Crime Control and Safe Streets Act of 1970, and the Applicant considering such act to be in the public interest and to its benefit to file an application under said Act, NOW THEREFORE

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF PARKER, FLORIDA, IN A REGULAR MEETING ASSEMBLED IN THE CITY OF PARKER, FLORIDA, THIS 7th OF SEPTEMBER, 1971, AS FOLLOWS:

- 1. That the project generally described above is in the best interests of the Applicant and the general public.
- 2. That Joseph B. Walker, Chief of Police, Parker, Florida, be hereby authorized to file in behalf of the Applicant an application in the form prescribed by the Florida Governor's Council on Criminal Justice in conformity with said Act, for a grant to be made to the Applicant to assist in paying the cost of the project gernerally described herein.
- 3. That if such grant be made, the Applicant shall provide or make necessary arrangements to provide such in-kind contributions as may be required by the Act.
- 4. That said Joseph B. Walker, Chief of Police, Parker, Florida, is hereby authorized to furnish such information and take such other action as may be necessary to enable the Applicant to qualify for said grant.
- 5. That the official designated in the preceding paragraphs is hereby designated as the authorized representative of the Applicant for the purpose of furnishing to the Florida Governor's Council on Criminal Justice such information, data and documents pertaining to the application for said grant as may be required and otherwise to act as the authorized representative of the Applicant in connection with this application.
 - 6. That certified copies of this resolution be included as part of

the application for said grant to be submitted to the Florida Governor's Council on Criminal Justice.

- 7. That if such grant be made, the Applicant or Official designated in Paragraphs 2 and 4 above shall maintain such records necessary and furnish such information, data and documents as required by the Florida Governor's Council on Criminal Justice to support the implementation of the project generally described above.
- 8. That this resolution shall take effect immediately upon its adoption.
