

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY OF PARKER:

Pursuant to Ordinance Number 81-103, as amended, it is hereby resolved:

1. Permit Fees. The fee for permit and inspection of building sewers shall be \$10 for a single building sewer plus \$5.00 for each additional building sewer covered by the permit. In the event that more than one inspection is required, there shall be an additional reinspection fee of \$5.00 per inspection.

2. Connection Fee. Any person obtaining a permit to connect to the public sewer more than 60 days following the date the public sewer is available for connection shall pay a fee of \$300 for each tap or connection to the public sewer.

3. Security Deposits. Each person obtaining a permit for connection to the public sewer of a building sewer serving a single family residence served by a separate water meter shall deposit with the city the sum of \$25.00 as security for payment for sewer charges, said deposit to be made prior to final inspection. All other users shall deposit a sum equal to twice the estimated monthly sewer charges, said estimate to be made by the head of the sewer department upon the best information available. In case of dispute over the amount of such estimate, the final determination shall be made by the City Council.

4. Base Charges. The base charge, as defined in Article V, Ordinance 81-103, for each single family residential unit served by a separate water meter shall be \$6.30 per month. The base charge for each commercial user shall be \$10.00, or \$6.30 per toilet served, whichever is greater. The base charge for industrial users shall be determined by the City Council. The base charge for each private sewer system utility, trailer park, multi-family dwelling, or other residential user where more than one residential unit is served by a single water meter or building sewer shall be

\$6.30 per residential unit served. The base charge shall be payable commencing on the date the public sewer is first available for connection by the user.

5. Additive charge. The additive charge, pursuant to Article V, Ordinance 81-103, for all users shall be \$1.35 per thousand gallons per month.
