

RESOLUTION NO. 2020-371

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY OF PARKER, FLORIDA,
REAFFIRMING, EXTENDING AND DECLARING A LOCAL STATE
OF EMERGENCY FOR HURRICANE SALLY AND PROVIDING AN
EFFECTIVE DATE AND DURATION.

WHEREAS, the City of Parker, Florida ("City") is a political subdivision of the State of Florida, which is authorized pursuant to Chapter 252, Florida Statutes, to declare a local state of emergency in the City and to exercise emergency powers to ensure the health, safety and welfare of the community.

WHEREAS, on September 14, 2020 Governor DeSantis issued an Executive Order 20-224 declaring a state of emergency in certain counties in the State of Florida for Hurricane Sally.

WHEREAS, on September 15, 2020 Governor DeSantis amended the prior declaration in Executive Order 20-225 to include Bay County (and therefore the municipalities located therein) to the statewide emergency declaration relative to Hurricane Sally.

WHEREAS, the Chairman of the Board of County Commissioners has signed a Resolution declaring a state of emergency in Bay County relative to Hurricane Sally;

WHEREAS, on September 16, 2020, the Mayor signed a declaration of an emergency within the City due to Hurricane Sally lasting for a period of seven (7) days thereafter ("Declaration"); and

WHEREAS, the City is suffering and will continue to suffer the effects of Hurricane Sally.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY OF PARKER, FLORIDA AS FOLLOWS:

1. The Declaration is hereby ratified and approved.
2. The local state of emergency continues to exist within the City due to the effects of Hurricane Sally and the potential exists that the effects of it could pose an immediate threat to citizens and property in the City. As such, the City Council extends and again declares a local state of emergency within the City.
3. This emergency may require the immediate assistance of municipal, state, and federal aid to address any emergency impacts on the citizens of the City.
4. This Resolution extending and further declaring a local state of emergency shall not trigger any overtime or other special employee compensation while the Declaration is in effect unless the Mayor authorizes special compensation as needed for essential employees.
5. The provisions of this Resolution shall remain in effect for a period of seven (7) days, unless terminated earlier by the City Council of the City.

6. This Resolution shall become effective immediately upon its passage and adoption.
