REGULAR MEETING MINUTES
HELD AT 1001 W. PARK ST, May 5, 2026 – 5:30 PM**

Mayor Kelly called the meeting to order with invocation followed by the Pledge of Allegiance.

Council Member Haney


1. Addressed the shed extension for Vincent Smith at 106 Morris Drive. Expressed his concern about the extension passing variance. Mr. Summerlin stated he has been in contact with Mr. Smith and stated the shed was grandfathered in. Mr. Smith does not want to pay for a survey to see if the shed is sitting on his property or does not want to join the property. If Mr. Smith alters the shed, variances will be needed.
2. Stated that there should be an RFP for attorney and all city contracts. Mrs. Anna Morris stated that the discussion of the cost of the city’s engineering contract was made but no change was made after that discussion. Mrs. Morris stated something will need to be done after this discussion to move forward. Council member Bodiford suggested that each contract be looked at separately, beginning with the attorney. Motion was made to approve by council member Haney and second by council member Bodiford. Vote was 4-1.

- Suggestion was made to accept donations of pet food. The food would be distributed to the different companies to help feed wild animals.


With no further discussion the meeting adjourned at 6:00 P.M.
